SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING

Don Nichols expressed concern about how we were going to finance the upcoming Jim Sloop and Stewart Hartley Scholarships. There was no quorum at this meeting to decide. However, at the September 18, 2007 regular Tuesday meeting a quick board meeting was convened. At that time Don made a motion to withhold \$7000.00 from the Legg Mason account to fund this upcoming year. In previous meetings it was approved by the board to withhold \$12,000 for current scholars. Of the \$21,000 currently in the Legg Mason account \$19,000 has now been set aside for scholarships. As invoices are received from the students the funds will be drawn from Legg Mason account.

POLIO PLUS UPDATE

From the Rotarian Sept 07

The progress in the last few years has been much slower than expected. However, the virus is now only endemic in very discrete, small areas of four countries-namely India, Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Nigeria.

In northern Nigeria, for about a year, leaders stopped all vaccination to children. This has been resolved. In India the problem is the massive population and in Afghanistan and Pakistan is fighting.

Dr. Robert S. Scott, chair of the International Polio Plus Committee, says that RI and Rotarians all over still believe in eradication of Polio. Now we must get mobilized, yet again, all over the Rotary world, to finally eradicate this disease. Get PolioPlus known again, especially among young people.
